

Create an estate that's equitable, and keep conflict out

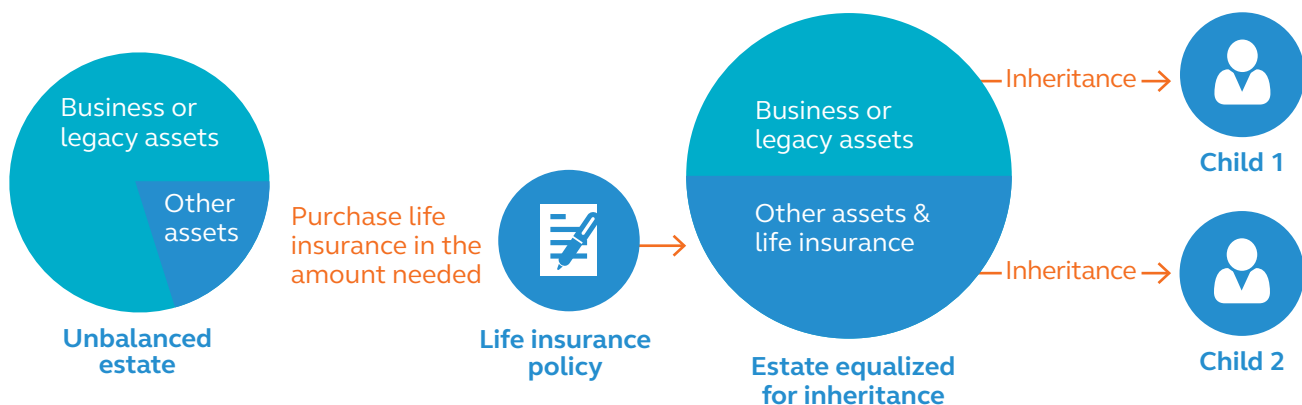
